Suspected coordinated cyberstalking, physical surveillance, unwanted online contact, harassment, and safety-related conduct

Requested action: Open or refer a formal investigation, preserve electronic evidence, provide victim-safety assistance, and pursue charges only if investigators and prosecutors determine that the admissible evidence establishes probable cause and all required elements of an offense.

Important evidentiary qualification

This report distinguishes documented records from Linda Joseph's personal observations and concerns. Election complaints, political criticism, public-record research, online comments, an arrest record, or an association between people do not independently prove a crime. The cumulative evidence is submitted so trained investigators can determine whether any conduct violated Florida law and whether coordination can be established through objective records.

COVER LETTER

Corrected consolidated submission with supporting evidence

Dear State Attorney Pryor and Victim Advocate Unit:

My name is Linda Joseph. I am a North Miami Beach resident, a candidate for the North Miami Beach City Commission, and a survivor of domestic violence. I respectfully request review of an escalating pattern of alleged cyberstalking, physical surveillance, unwanted online contact, publication of sensitive residence-related information, repeated election complaints, and safety-related conduct involving Stephanie Kienzle, publisher of VotersOpinion.com; Bruce Lamberto; and former North Miami Beach Commissioner Barbara Monuse Kramer.

I want all criminal conduct supported by the evidence to be investigated and prosecuted. I understand that I cannot direct an arrest or charging decision. I respectfully ask law enforcement and the State Attorney's Office to determine whether probable cause exists and whether criminal charges are appropriate.

I believe the conduct may be coordinated. The documented links presently include: Bruce Lamberto's repeated Florida Elections Commission complaints and use of photographs of my vehicle; Stephanie Kienzle's sustained publications and separate election complaint; Barbara Kramer's repeated unwanted engagement on my personal Facebook page after I asked her to stop; and an August 5, 2026 email in which Ms. Kienzle intentionally copied Ms. Kramer into a campaign-related discussion about me. These links warrant investigation, but I recognize that they do not alone establish a criminal agreement.

I am particularly concerned because I personally identify Mr. Lamberto as the individual appearing to photograph or document my vehicle. I also have safety concerns based on information I have received about him. I am not asking the Office to treat an online mugshot page, an arrest, or allegations about prior violence as proof of guilt. I ask investigators to verify any relevant criminal-history or public-safety information through official records and assess whether it affects safety planning.

Because I am a domestic-violence survivor, please protect my current and former addresses, vehicle information, telephone number, and sensitive location information to the fullest extent permitted by law. Please advise me how to provide original photographs, metadata, complete emails, social-media exports, and certified election-complaint records.

DETAILED INCIDENT AND EVIDENCE REPORT

1. Summary of reported pattern

- A sustained series of VotersOpinion.com publications about Linda Joseph beginning on or about March 13, 2026, including accusations concerning criminality, identity, residence, finances, religion, intelligence, character, and candidacy.
- Repeated correction, retraction, and safety notices to Stephanie Kienzle, including notice that publication of residence information created a special risk because Linda is a domestic-violence survivor.
- Two Florida Elections Commission matters filed by Bruce Lamberto, including FEC 26-198, which referenced or relied upon photographs of Linda's automobile to challenge her residency.
- A separate Florida Elections Commission complaint, FEC 26-139, filed by Stephanie Kienzle and containing Linda's former address, apartment number, telephone number, and candidacy information.
- Photographs Linda says depict Bruce Lamberto photographing or documenting her vehicle, plus complaint materials using or referencing photographs of the vehicle.
- Repeated comments attributed to Barbara Monuse Kramer on Linda's personal Facebook page, including further comments in the same discussion after Linda asked her to stop interfering.
- An August 5, 2026 email thread documenting that Stephanie Kienzle intentionally copied Barbara Kramer into a campaign-related communication concerning Linda.
- Linda's reports of people appearing to follow or monitor her and individuals yelling derogatory or hostile statements; investigators are asked to determine whether these events are connected to the documented online and administrative activity.

2. Stephanie Kienzle and VotersOpinion.com

Beginning on or about March 13, 2026, VotersOpinion.com began publishing a sustained series of articles concerning Linda shortly after she publicly entered the North Miami Beach election. The evidence assessment previously prepared identified at least 21 dated articles between March 13 and August 10, 2026; a broader audit identified approximately 26 posts referencing her.

The publications reportedly addressed Linda's identity, residence, candidacy, family, finances, religion, intelligence, appearance, temperament, and alleged criminal conduct. Linda disputes the factual accusations and repeatedly requested corrections or retractions. She also notified Ms. Kienzle that publishing or circulating residence-related information created a serious safety risk because Linda is a domestic-violence survivor.

The most recent separate article specifically concerning Linda located in the prior audit was dated August 10, 2026. It reproduced Linda's written request that the attacks stop and continued with additional accusations and residence-related assertions. Investigators should preserve the site, hosting records, publication logs, submitted materials, emails, and any available analytics or access records before content changes or disappears.

3. Bruce Lamberto: FEC 26-198 and vehicle photographs

Florida Elections Commission Case No. FEC 26-198 was filed by Bruce Lamberto against Linda and was reportedly received on July 27, 2026. It challenged Linda's North Miami Beach residence and eligibility to seek office. The complaint referenced another property and photographs of Linda's automobile, including photographs reportedly showing her vehicle at a property on NW 157th Street.

Linda personally identifies the automobile depicted in the complaint materials as her vehicle. She also states that she possesses photographs depicting Mr. Lamberto appearing to photograph or document her vehicle. The original files, not merely screenshots or edited copies, should be collected and forensically reviewed for timestamps, device information, location data, file history, and transmission records.

On August 3, 2026, Linda responded to FEC 26-198 and wrote that the complaint repeatedly referenced another property and photographs of her automobile in an attempt to question her residency. She explained that the location of a vehicle or isolated observations do not establish domicile. She also placed her safety concerns regarding the complainant on the record and reported prior law-enforcement contact concerning conduct that included following her. The Commission acknowledged receipt on August 4, 2026.

4. Earlier Bruce Lamberto matter: FEC 26-095

Bruce Lamberto also filed FEC Case No. 26-095. That complaint alleged that language in campaign correspondence or a public-records request misrepresented Linda as a sitting official. Linda responded on May 27, 2026, denied fraudulent intent, described disputed wording as a clerical or formatting error, and confirmed future use of candidate-only identification. She separately requested review of what she believed was harassing, retaliatory, or bad-faith conduct.

The act of filing complaints is not itself offered as proof of a crime. The repeated filings are included in the chronology because one matter involved physical observation or photography of Linda's vehicle and because investigators may be able to determine the source and transmission of the evidence.

5. Stephanie Kienzle matter: FEC 26-139

FEC Case No. 26-139 was filed separately by Stephanie Kienzle and concerned campaign-related social-media posts and political-advertisement disclaimers. Linda responded on August 10, 2026, denying a knowing or willful violation and requesting dismissal. The complaint form contains Linda's former street address, apartment number, telephone number, and candidacy information. The existence of this complaint does not prove coordination with Mr. Lamberto, but it establishes a separate administrative action by the VotersOpinion.com publisher and a record containing sensitive personal information.

6. Barbara Kramer: repeated unwanted Facebook engagement

The attached screenshots show comments attributed to Barbara Monuse Kramer within the comment thread of Linda's August 4, 2026 personal Facebook post. The screenshots depict activity on Linda's page, not on Ms. Kramer's page. Linda reports that she has not gone onto Ms. Kramer's personal page to attack or confront her and that she repeatedly asked Ms. Kramer to leave her alone and stop returning to her page.

In the preserved thread, Linda wrote: "I respectfully ask you to stop trying to interfere with my campaign and allow me to run my race." Linda further reports that her repeated requests included words to the effect: "Barbara, please do not come back onto my page. I have asked you repeatedly to leave me alone."

Comments attributed to Ms. Kramer's account in the same Facebook discussion include calling Linda "hysterical," telling her to "take yourself back to Biscayne Gardens," accusing her of making false accusations, and questioning records allegedly identifying different places of birth. Linda experienced the comments about birthplace, citizenship, and where she should "take" herself as humiliating and intimidating in light of her identity as a Black Haitian immigrant.

The screenshots establish content and account attribution visible at the time captured, but the display shows relative time markers such as “1w,” not complete timestamps. Investigators should obtain the original post URL, full comment export, notification emails, platform records, edit/delete history, and exact timestamps before drawing conclusions about sequence or legal significance.

7. Documented Kienzle-Kramer email connection

An August 5, 2026 “Re: campaign” email thread documents a direct communication channel between Stephanie Kienzle and Barbara Kramer concerning Linda and her campaign. After Linda raised concerns involving Ms. Kramer and a campaign endorsement, Ms. Kienzle stated that Linda should take the issue up with Ms. Kramer and said she was copying Ms. Kramer so she could respond.

Ms. Kienzle initially failed to copy Ms. Kramer and sent a follow-up approximately two minutes later stating: “I forgot to copy Mrs. Kramer as I stated; therefore, I am resending this email accordingly.” The resent email copied Barbara Kramer at barbaralmkramer@gmail.com. A later message in the thread also copied Ms. Kramer.

Ms. Kienzle also stated that she had a very small team of individuals whom she had known for years and trusted. That statement did not identify Ms. Kramer or Mr. Lamberto as members of the team and should not be represented as proof that either person belonged to it. The email establishes acquaintance and a deliberate communication channel; it does not by itself establish criminal coordination.

8. Physical surveillance and other reported encounters

Linda reports incidents in which people appeared to follow or monitor her and individuals yelled derogatory or hostile statements. She personally identifies Bruce Lamberto as the person depicted in her photographs appearing to photograph or document her vehicle. Investigators should determine whether any encounters are connected to Ms. Kienzle, Ms. Kramer, VotersOpinion.com, election complaints, or other persons through communications, location records, witness accounts, and metadata.

Linda describes Mr. Lamberto as potentially dangerous based on information she has received and an online mugshot page she located. An arrest image or allegation is not proof of guilt or violent conduct. Investigators should independently verify any relevant history through official records and use only verified information for risk assessment.

9. WakeUp NMB public-meeting incident

Linda’s broader report includes a June 8, 2026 incident at a publicly advertised WakeUp NMB meeting held at the City-owned Marjorie & William McDonald Center. She reports that she was told she could not attend future meetings, her offer to pay a stated membership fee was refused, and another person would decide whether she could participate. She later submitted a sworn ethics complaint. This incident is not offered as independent proof of stalking or coordination; investigators are asked to determine whether any involved people overlap with the online, election-complaint, or vehicle-photography evidence.

10. Basis for requesting an investigation of possible coordination

Linda believes the combined timing and overlap warrant investigation of communications among the three reported individuals. The presently documented connections are limited but material:

- Ms. Kienzle intentionally copied Ms. Kramer into an August 5 campaign-related email concerning Linda.

- Ms. Kramer repeatedly engaged on Linda's personal Facebook page in a public confrontation concerning Linda's campaign, residence, birthplace, and credibility.
- Mr. Lamberto filed repeated election complaints, one of which relied on or referenced photographs of Linda's automobile.
- Ms. Kienzle separately filed an election complaint and published a sustained series of articles about Linda.
- Linda personally identifies Mr. Lamberto as appearing to photograph or document her vehicle.
- Residence, identity, candidacy, and credibility are recurring subjects across the online publications, social-media comments, and election complaints.

These facts do not establish a conspiracy or criminal agreement. They identify investigative leads. Coordination should be alleged as a concern to be tested through records—not stated as a proven conclusion.

11. Requested investigative steps

1. Accept or refer a formal law-enforcement report and assign an investigator experienced in stalking, cyberstalking, online harassment, and electronic evidence.
2. Obtain complete certified records and attachments for FEC Cases 26-095, 26-198, and 26-139.
3. Determine who took, directed, received, transmitted, or submitted the photographs of Linda's vehicle used or referenced in FEC 26-198.
4. Forensically preserve and examine Linda's original photographs depicting Mr. Lamberto and all available metadata.
5. Preserve and examine the complete August 5 "Re: campaign" email thread, including headers, timestamps, recipients, forwarding history, and metadata.
6. Preserve and examine Facebook records associated with the August 4 post, including the complete thread, URLs, account identifiers, timestamps, edits, deletions, notifications, and Linda's requests that Ms. Kramer stop.
7. Determine whether Ms. Kramer supplied information, screenshots, public records, allegations, or research to Ms. Kienzle, Mr. Lamberto, or VotersOpinion.com.
8. Determine whether Ms. Kienzle, Ms. Kramer, and Mr. Lamberto communicated about Linda's residence, vehicle, movements, candidacy, endorsements, campaign, election complaints, or online publications.
9. Compare the timing and distinctive language of Facebook comments, VotersOpinion.com posts, FEC complaints, vehicle photography, and reported in-person encounters.
10. Determine whether nonpublic information concerning Linda's residence, vehicle, location, or schedule was obtained or shared.
11. Preserve relevant VotersOpinion.com hosting, authoring, access, submission, and publication records through appropriate legal process.
12. Verify any relevant criminal-history or safety information about Mr. Lamberto through official sources; do not rely on a commercial mugshot webpage as proof.
13. Assess whether the admissible evidence satisfies the elements of stalking, cyberstalking, threats, harassment, unlawful access, witness intimidation, conspiracy, or any other applicable offense.
14. If probable cause and the legal elements are established, pursue appropriate charges against any responsible person. If not, advise Linda about civil injunctions, safety planning, and preservation of evidence.

12. Requested confidentiality and victim assistance

Linda requests that current and former residential addresses, apartment numbers, telephone numbers, vehicle identifiers, location information, and other sensitive personal information be protected to the fullest extent permitted by law. She requests contact with the Victim Advocate Unit, safety-planning assistance, instructions for providing original digital evidence, and guidance on whether to seek an injunction for protection against stalking.

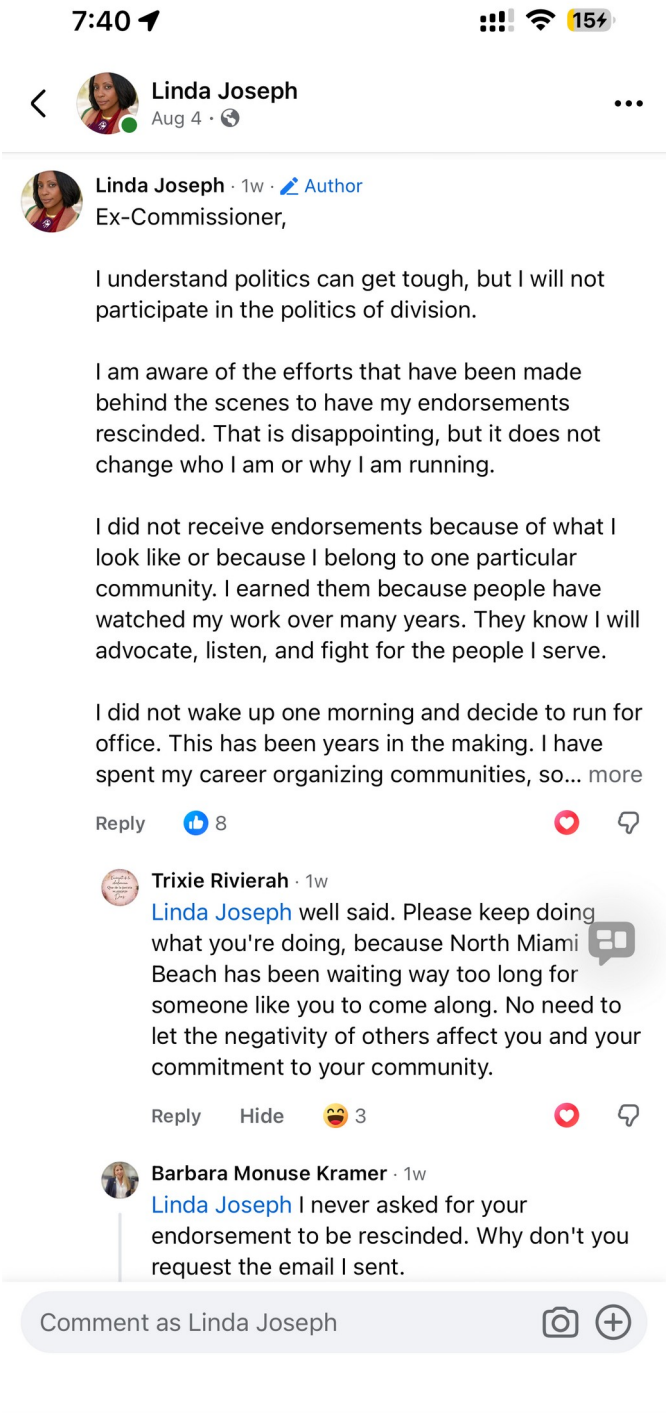


Exhibit A-1. Linda Joseph’s August 4 Facebook post and a comment attributed to Barbara Monuse Kramer concerning the endorsement email.

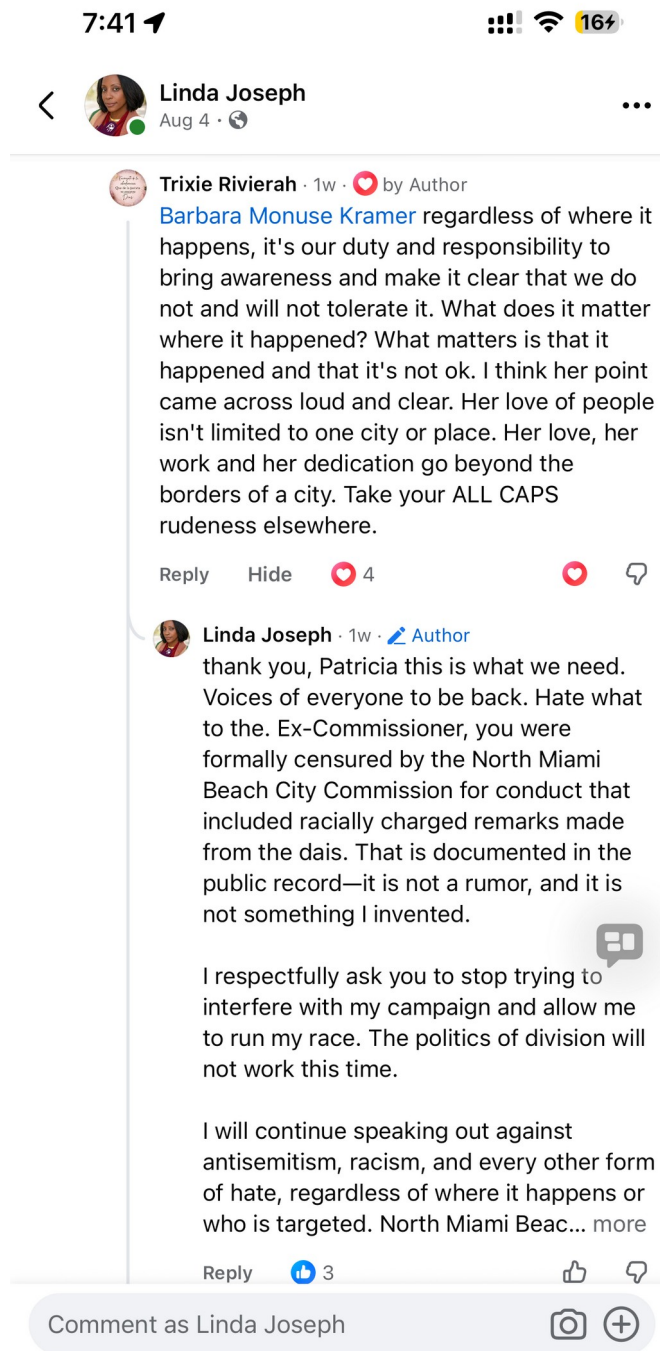


Exhibit A-2. Linda's written request that the former commissioner stop trying to interfere with her campaign.

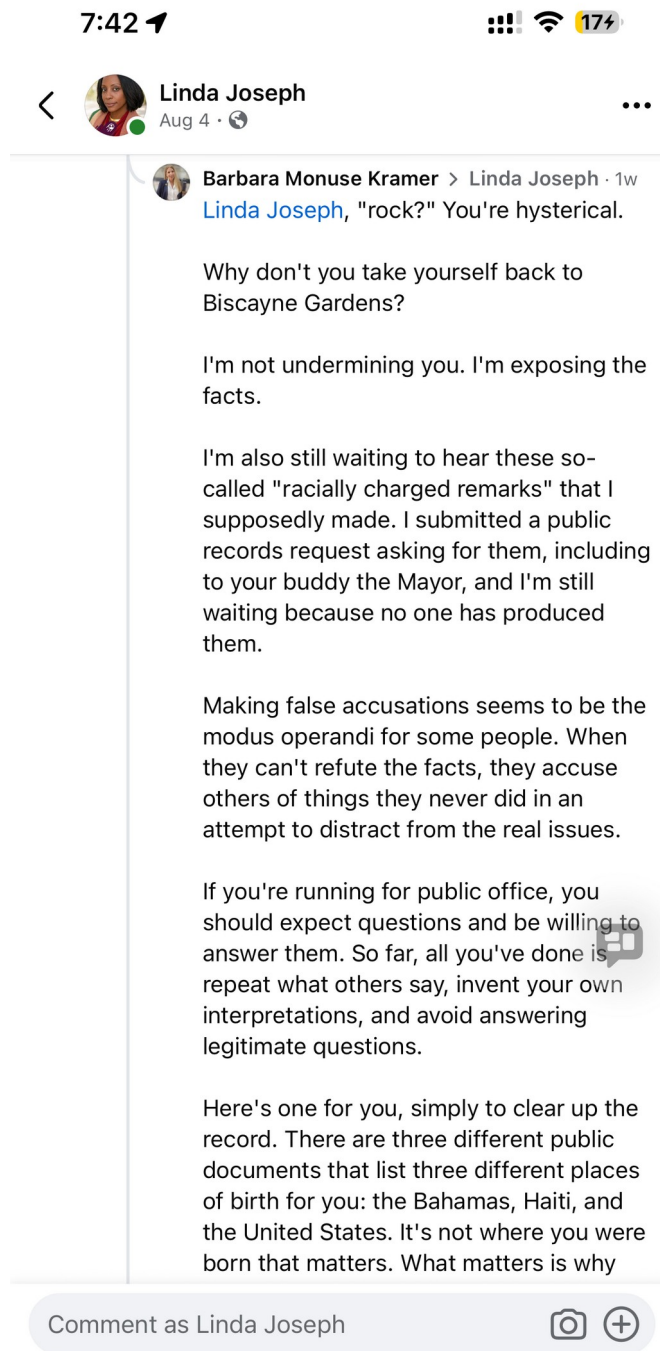

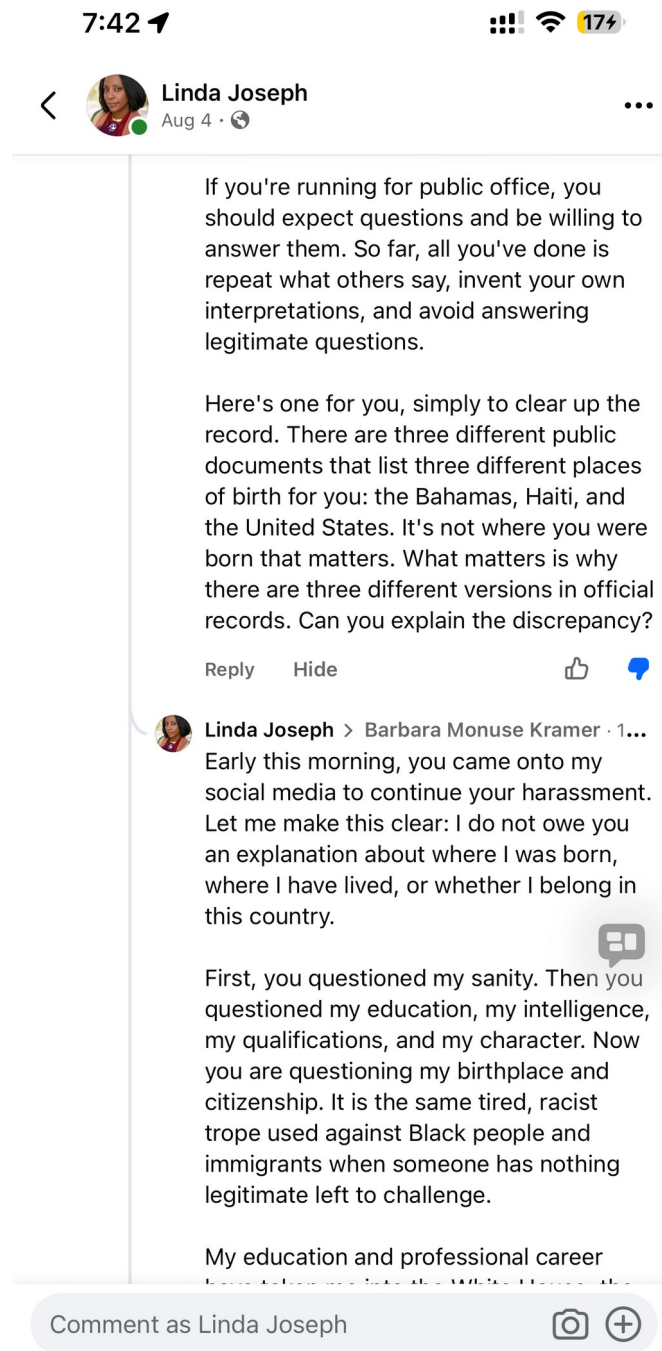


Exhibit A-4. Continuation of the birthplace-record question and Linda's response describing the interaction as harassment.
